

Template Checklist

The template is a key step in BAGM's project process. Using our LT3 Raptor laser and software, we create a precise digital drawing of your project. Our technician reviews all design details on-site to confirm accuracy. Occasionally, site conditions may require minor adjustments to the design or timeline.



Decision Maker On-Site

- ☐ The primary decision maker (usually the homeowner, but possibly a designer, builder, or cabinet maker) should be present during the template.



Site Readiness

All supporting structures – cabinets, brackets, walls, trim, etc. must be secured in final locations and fully accessible.

- ☐ In some cases, upper cabinets, trim, or end wall cabinets may need to be left off until after the template (typically with full-height backsplashes or tight spaces).
- ☐ Clear off all cabinets and countertops; empty sink base cabinets.



Cut-Out Products

- ☐ Have all cut-out items (sinks, faucets, cooktops, grommets, outlets, etc.) on-site. While BAGM maintains a library of common cut-outs, we may need physical items or manufacturer specs for certain products. Some digitized cut-outs may include an additional charge. Certain items—like apron-front sinks—must be installed prior to templating.



Existing Countertops

- ☐ In most cases, we can template with existing countertops in place. However, removal may be required depending on site conditions, as determined during the pre-template review or by the technician on-site.



Project Timeline

- ☐ Occasionally, our technician may recommend phasing parts of the project based on site conditions.
